Agenda No. 1

Boxing – Holding of 5th Junior Women National Championship at Erode (TN) from 3-7th July, 2010 (No. 19-6/2010-SP.III)

The proposal for conducting 5th **Junior Women National Championship at Erode (TN) from 3-7th July, 2010** was considered. The Federation is eligible for an assistance of Rs. 2.00 lakh for the purpose. As there are no UCs pending against the federation, the Committee recommended the proposal for an assistance of Rs.2.00 lakh and release of 75% advance. The federation has been given annual recognition for 2010 and also has complied with the RTI instructions.

Agenda No. 2

Boxing – Holding of 1st Sub-Junior Women National Championship at Erode (TN) from 3-7th May, 2010 (No. 19-5/2010-SP.III)

The proposal for conducting 1st **Sub-Junior Women National Championship at Erode (TN) from 3-7th May, 2010** was considered. The Federation is eligible for an assistance of Rs. 3.00 lakh for the purpose. As there are no UCs pending against the federation, the Committee recommended the proposal for an assistance of Rs.3.00 lakh and release of 75% advance. The federation has been given annual recognition for 2010 and also has complied with the RTI instructions.

Agenda No. 3

Boxing – Holding of 26th Junior Boys National Championship at Chennai (TN) from 30th June to 4th July, 2010 (No. 19-4/2010-SP.III)

The proposal for conducting 26th **Junior Boys National Championship at Chennai (TN) from 30th June to 4th July, 2010** was considered. The Federation is eligible for an assistance of Rs. 2.00 lakh for the purpose. As there are no UCs pending against the

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federation, the Committee recommended the proposal for an assistance of Rs.2.00 lakh and release of 75% advance. The federation has been given annual recognition for 2010 and also has complied with the RTI instructions.

Agenda No. 4

Tennikoit – Holding of 10th North Zone Championship at Haridwar (Uttarakhand) from 4th to 6th June, 2010 (No. 63-4/2010-SP.I)

The proposal for conducting **10th North Zone Championship at Haridwar (Uttarakhand) from 4th to 6th June, 2010** was considered. The Federation is eligible for an assistance of Rs. 1.00 lakh for the purpose. As there are no UCs pending against the federation, the Committee recommended the proposal for an assistance of Rs.1.00 lakh and release of 75% advance. The federation has been given annual recognition for 2010 and also has complied with the RTI instructions.

Agenda No. 5

Taekwondo – Holding of 2nd West Zone Championship at Margo (Goa) from 28-30th May, 2010 (No. 72-5/2010-SP.I)

The proposal for conducting **2nd West Zone Championship at Margo (Goa) from 28-30th May, 2010** was considered. The Federation is eligible for an assistance of Rs. 1.00 lakh for the purpose. As there are no UCs pending against the federation, the Committee recommended the proposal for an assistance of Rs.1.00 lakh and release of 75% advance. The federation has been given annual recognition for 2010 and also has complied with the RTI instructions.

Agenda No. 6

Soft Tennis – Holding of 6th Junior Boys & Girls National Championship at Dewas (MP) from 2-6th June, 2010 (No. 99-2/2010-SP.I)

The proposal for conducting **6th Junior Boys & Girls National Championship at Dewas (MP) from 2-6th June, 2010** was considered. The Federation is eligible for an assistance of Rs. 4.00 lakh for the purpose. As there are no UCs pending against the federation, the Committee recommended the proposal for an assistance of Rs.4.00 lakh and release of 75% advance. The federation has been given annual recognition for 2010 and also has complied with the RTI instructions.

Agenda No. 7

Tennis – Holding of ITF Junior Tennis Tournament for girls at New Delhi from 17-22nd May, 2010 (No. 37-4/2010-SP.I)

The proposal for conducting **ITF Junior Tennis Tournament for girls at New Delhi from 17-22nd May, 2010** was considered. The Federation is eligible for an assistance of Rs. 6.00 lakh for the purpose. As there are no UCs pending against the federation, the Committee recommended the proposal for an assistance of Rs.6.00 lakh and release of 75%

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advance. The federation has been given annual recognition for 2010 and also has complied with the RTI instructions.

Agenda No. 8

Tennis – Holding of ITF Junior Tennis Tournament for boys at New Delhi from 17-22nd May, 2010 (No. 37-3/2010-SP.I)

The proposal for conducting **ITF Junior Tennis Tournament for boys at New Delhi from 17-22nd May, 2010** was considered. The Federation is eligible for an assistance of Rs. 6.00 lakh for the purpose. As there are no UCs pending against the federation, the Committee recommended the proposal for an assistance of Rs.6.00 lakh and release of 75% advance. The federation has been given annual recognition for 2010 and also has complied with the RTI instructions.

Agenda No. 9

Taekwondo – Holding of 1st India Open International Taekwondo Championship at Bangalore from 7-9th May, 2010 (No. 72-7/2010-SP.I)

The proposal for conducting **1st India Open International Taekwondo Championship at Bangalore from 7-9th May, 2010** was considered. The Federation is eligible for an assistance of Rs. 6.00 lakh for the purpose. As there are no UCs pending against the federation, the Committee recommended the proposal for an assistance of Rs. 6.00 lakh and release of 75% advance. The federation has been given annual recognition for 2010 and also has complied with the RTI instructions.

Agenda No. 10

Tenpin Bowling –Proposal for training at Malaysia from 15-28th May, 2010 and participation in 43rd Singapore International Open from 28th May to 6th June, 2010 (F. 90-2/2010-SP.I)

This is a non-mandatory event hence would count towards other exposures. The team consists of 20 persons (14 men + 5 women and 1 coach) for training at Malaysia and 13 persons (8 men, 4 women and 1 coach) for participation in tournament at Singapore. The selection of the players has been done on the basis of past performance. The SAI's representative informed that the event is included in the LTDP and Asian Games-2010 Plan for preparation of teams. The likely expenditure of the visit is Rs. 19,60,560/- + Visa fee, insurance, airport tax etc.. The federation has been given annual recognition for 2010 and also has complied with the RTI instructions. The Committee, therefore recommended visit of the proposed team at full cost to the Government as per details given below:

1.	Air Passage cost for 20 persons (19 players & 1 coach) for the sector Bangalore-Kualalumpur-Bangalore. Agenda No. 11

Yatching –Proposal for participation in Singapore Laser Trophy, 2010 from 1-6th June, 2010 (F. 54-3/2010-SP.I)

This is a non-mandatory event hence would count towards other exposures. The team consists of 3 persons (2 players & 1 coach). The selection of the players is yet to be done in selection trials. The SAI's representative informed that the event is included in the LTDP. The likely expenditure of the visit is Rs. 1,92,165/- + Visa fee, insurance, airport tax etc.. The federation has been given annual recognition for 2010 but has not complied with the RTI instructions. As such the Committee recommended the proposal for rejection.

Agenda No. 12

Taekwondo –Proposal for participation in 19th Asian Sr. Taekwondo Championship, 2010 at Astana (Kazakhstan) from 20-23rd May, 2010 (F. 72-4/2010-SP.I)

This is a mandatory event hence would not count towards other exposures. The team consists of 15 persons (12 players (6 men & 6 women) & 2 coaches and 1 Trainer). The selection of the players has been done on the basis of selection trials. The SAI's representative informed that the event is included in the LTDP and preparation of the team for Asian Games 2010 Plan. The likely expenditure of the visit is Rs. 13,01,850/- + Entry fee, Visa fee, insurance, airport tax etc. as per actual. The federation has been given annual recognition for 2010 and also has complied with the RTI instructions. The Committee, therefore, recommended visit of 12 players, 2 coaches and 1 Trainer at full cost to the Government and one manager at no cost to the Government as per details given below:

Athletic –Proposal for participation in Asian Area Qualification Championships for Youth Olympic Games 2010 at Singapore from 20-23rd May, 2010 (F. 13-4/2010-SP.III)

This is a mandatory event and also the Asian Qualifying event for Youth Olympics, hence would not count towards other exposures. The team consists of 26 persons (22 players (14 men & 8 women) & 4 coaches). The selection of the players has been done on the basis of selection trials. The Government Observer has given her consent for the selection. The SAI's representative informed that the event is included in the LTDP and preparation of the team for Asian Games 2010 Plan. The likely expenditure of the visit is Rs. 15,48,000/- + Entry fee, Visa fee, insurance, airport tax etc. as per actual. The federation has been given annual recognition for 2010 and also has complied with the RTI instructions. The Committee, therefore, recommended visit of 22 players & 4 coaches at full cost to the Government and one manager at no cost to the Government as per details given below:

1.	Air Passage cost for 26 persons (22 players, and 4 coaches) for the sector Bhopal/Ooty-Delhi-Singapore-Delhi-Bhopal/Ooty. The estimate is on the basis of full fare economy class and the federation would be advised to procure the cheapest available fare in excursion class, visa fees, airport tax, insurance will be as per actual.	Rs. 11,70,000/- @ Rs 45,000/- per head for 26 persons + Visa fee, airport tax, Insurance as per actual

Tug of War – Holding of Senior Men National Championship at Patiala (Punjab) from 12-14th June, 2010 (No. 89-2/2010-SP.I)

The proposal for conducting **Senior Men National Championship at Patiala (Punjab) from 12-14th June, 2010** was considered. The Federation is eligible for an assistance of

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Rs. 1.00 lakh for the purpose. As the federation has not complied with the RTI instructions.

Supplementary Agenda No. 3

Paralympic – Participation in IWAS Wheel Chair Fencing World Cup at Italy from 21-23rd May, 2010 (No. 89-2/2010-SP.I)

The proposal was deferred by the Committee as no report has been received from the federation on the complaint made on the selection of the players.

The meeting ended with a Vote of Thanks to the Chair & Members.

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The drafts minutes of the Departmental Committee meeting, under the Scheme for Assistance to National Sports Federations, held on 5th May, 2010 at 3.00 PM have been attempted and placed below at F/ "X" for approval pl.

As per the provisions of the Scheme for Assistance to NSFs, the Committee discussed the proposals for financial assistance to NSFs for participation of Indian teams/sportspersons in various international tournaments abroad, holding of international tournaments in India, and holding of national/Zonal Championships in India.

In all 14 proposals (4 proposals for participation in tournaments abroad, 5 for holding national Championships and 3 for holding international events in India and 3 for holding Zonal Championships were placed before the Committee for consideration in the meeting. Out of these 15 proposals, the Committee considered and recommended 14 proposals for approval and deferred one proposal for want of some clarifications from the federation, on a complaint, regarding selection of players.
