Monthly Report for the month of February, 2024

Name of the Ministry / Department: Department of Sports

1. Important policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month:

- a) The 4th edition of Khelo India University Games (KIUG), named as "Ashtalakshmi Games", was jointly organized by Assam and the North-Eastern States between 19th and 29th February 2024. The Games witnessed the participation of over 4600 athletes from all the States/UTs. In the final medals Tally, Chandigarh University finished at the top with 71 medals (32 gold, 18 silver, 21 bronze).
- b) The 4th edition of the Khelo India Winter Games (KIWG) was organized in two phases, with the first phase hosted between 2nd and 6th February 2024 in Leh, Ladakh, for Ice Sports and, the second phase between 21st and 25th February 2024 in Gulmarg, J&K, for Snow Sports. A total of 650 athletes participated in the KIWG in 06 sports disciplines. The Indian Army team topped the medal tally with 21 medals (10 gold, 05 silver, 06 bronze), followed by Karnataka and Maharashtra. On the sidelines of the KIWG, a Memorandum of Understanding was signed between the Sports Authority of India and the Department of Sports, UT Administration of Ladakh, for establishing a Khelo India Centre of Excellence in the UT.
- c) The first-ever Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC) Aquatics Championship was organized between 6th and 9th February in New Delhi. Around 300 athletes from the BIMSTEC member nations actively participated in the event, with India emerging as the overall champion.
- d) In a significant development, a Centre of Excellence for Nutritional Supplements Testing for Sportspersons (CoE-NSTS), established at the

National Forensic Sciences University, Gandhinagar, Gujarat, was inaugurated on 9th February 2024. This centre will play an active role in ensuring that our athletes have access to standard nutritional supplements by enabling the testing of such supplements sold in the open market. This laboratory has been funded by this Ministry, and is the first of its kind in South Asia.

- e) As a key step towards digital transformation for sports development, disbursing merit certificates to athletes for their sporting achievements has been digitized and integrated with DigiLocker. All the National Sports Federations (NSFs) have been advocated to utilise this feature to ensure authenticity, transparency and accessibility of the sports certificates issued to the athletes.
- f) To commemorate India's success in hosting the biennial FIDE Chess Olympiad in 2022, the Torch for the Olympiad was passed to Hungary (the next host) at a handoff ceremony held in New Delhi on 14th February 2024. As a matter of pride for the country, India became the first-ever nation to host a torch relay for the FIDE Chess Olympiad in 2022 and, the torch for all subsequent editions of the Chess Olympiad will start its journey from India, the land where Chess originated.
- g) Various activities have been carried out under the Annual Capacity Building Plan by this Department. Under this initiative, a training session was organized for the officials on 26.02.2024, covering various key topics in sports including the History of sports, the Olympic Movement, major sports events, and the National Sports Development Code.
- h) The 121st, 122nd, 123rd and 124th Meetings of Mission Olympics Cell (MOC) were held on 01.02.2024, 08.02.2024, 15.02.2024 and 22.02.2024 respectively on various components of TOPS. Proposals from athletes from various sporting disciplines worth Rs. 2,01,26,085 were approved.

5. Status of ongoing Swachhta Abhiyan (progress under Special Campaign):

Following activities were conducted for the special campaign of Swachhta Abhiyan:

- a) The Swachhta Campaign is being actively implemented by the National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA) and National Dope Testing Laboratory (NDTL) to integrate cleanliness as a part of the work culture. In February, a cleanliness drive was organized in the office premises of NADA and NDTL.
- b) As a part of the Swachhta campaign, cleanliness drives are organized at the Sports Authority of India (SAI) Headquarters and its Regional Centres with the active participation of the staff and athletes. Similar initiatives are also taken at the Lakshmibai National Institute of Physical Education (LNIPE) for a clean and hygienic campus.
- 6. Status of Rationalization of Autonomous Bodies:

Does not arise in the case of D/o Sports as all the five Autonomous Bodies-SAI, LNIPE, National Sports University (NSU), NADA and NDTL have been set up for specific purposes.
