Monthly Report for the month of January, 2024

Name of the Ministry / Department: Department of Sports

1. Important policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month:

- a) The Hon'ble President of India conferred the National Sports Awards 2023 in a grand ceremony held at Rashtrapati Bhavan on 9th January, 2024. Two of India's top-ranked Badminton players who are globally ranked-1, Chirag Shetty and Satwiksairaj Rankireddy, were conferred with the prestigious Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna Award this year. The other awards that were conferred upon athletes, coaches and institutions include the Arjuna Awards, the Dronacharya Awards, the Dhyan Chand Awards for Lifetime Achievement in Sports and Games, the Rashtriya Khel Protsahan Puruskar and the Maulana Abul Kalam Azad Trophy.
- b) The 6th edition of Khelo India Youth Games hosted by Tamil Nadu was organized successfully between 19th and 31st January 2024 across 04 cities of the state. With over 7200 participants including 4454 athletes from all States/UTs, the event further strengthened the role of the flagship Khelo India Scheme which has emerged as a major platform for our athletes to showcase their talent. In terms of the results, Maharashtra finished 1st in the medal tally with 158 medals (57 gold, 48 silver, 53 bronze), followed by Tamil Nadu with 98 medals (38 gold, 21 silver, 39 bronze) and Haryana with 103 medals (35 gold, 22 silver, 46 bronze).
- c) The first-ever Beach Games in India, were organized in UT of Diu between 4th and 11th January 2024. More than 1400 athletes participated in the event with Madhya Pradesh emerging as the overall champion.
- d) The Target Olympic Podium Scheme (TOPS) is playing a pivotal role in improving Indian athletes' performance on the international stage, and enables the elite talent of the country to get the best training, support and for participation in international competitions. The success of the TOPS could be observed through the recent accomplishments of Indian athletes including Sh Rohan Bopanna, a TOPS athlete, winning the Australian Open Grand Slam and reaching World No-1 in Tennis Doubles Ranking and the Indian shooting contingent finishing with 6 Medals (2G, 3S, 1B) in the Shooting World Cup held in Cairo, Egypt.
- e) The 'Fit India Champions' podcast series was launched by this Ministry to showcase inspiring stories of Indian sporting heroes. With episodes featuring star athletes like Neeraj Chopra and Sheetal Devi, the podcast series aims to inspire the audience to adopt a physically active and healthy lifestyle through the journey of these athletes.
- f) The Logo and Mascot for the Khelo India Winter Games (KIWG) 2024 were unveiled on 30th January 2024. The first leg of the KIWG organized in UT of Ladakh is the first-ever KIWG event held outside UT of Jammu and Kashmir.
- g) The National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA) organized a total of 70 Anti-Doping Education Awareness programmes across the country during the month.
- h) Various activities have been carried out under the Annual Capacity Building Plan by this Department. Under this initiative, an exposure / immersion visit to National Centre of Excellence, Sonipat, Haryana and a training session on the Legislative and

Parliamentary Processes were organized for the Department Officials on 17.01.2024 and 22.01.2024 respectively.

- b) Swachhta Campaigns have been organized at all the Regional Centres and the Head Office of Sports Authority of India (SAI) on a regular basis, where the premises are cleaned, sanitized and disinfected.
- c) The Lakshmibai National Institute of Physical Education (LNIPE) premises along with sports infrastructure and residential blocks were cleaned under the Swachhta Abhiyan.
